Other things to try out this week:	
<p><b>Viewpoints</b> – three activities based around physical viewpoints.</p> <p>For the next two weeks (this week and next), we will be looking at different <b>viewpoints</b> for our topic work. A viewpoint is either a physical viewpoint (what you can see) or a personal viewpoint (someone's personal opinion). This week we will be exploring physical viewpoints.</p> <p>Here are this week's activities you could have a go at :</p> <p>1) <u>Viewpoints from your home</u></p> <p>Choose a window in your house and look out of it at different times during the day/week. What stays the same? What is different each time? Do you have the same emotions every time you look at that view? Does the weather change how you see things? What questions could you ask about what/who you see out of your window? Show your thoughts and questions however you want, as creatively as you like! You could draw pictures, you could keep a diary of what you've seen or you could take photos and describe the differences.</p>	

2) UK Based landmarks (For example King's College Chapel, The Houses of Parliament, Big Ben, The Angel of the North, The Tower of London, Cheddar Gorge, Stonehenge)

Use the internet to compare then and now images of local or national landmarks. Start by finding similarities and differences between the images then consider what people living in each era would be thinking about or concerned about at that time.

3) Viewpoints from around the world.

Can you research a famous viewpoint from around the world (e.g The Eiffel Tower, The Grand Canyon, Victoria Falls etc.)? Draw what you think you would be able to see from this viewpoint, and what would be happening in this area. You could use Google Maps to help discover what is around the landmark. You can present your ideas however you like. Could you draw a map? Could you write about the area? Could you write a fact file? Could you make a model of the area or the landmark?
