Maths tasks (aim to do one a day)	Reading tasks (aim to do one a day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none">Log on to Education City and play the games set as homework.Complete Summer Arithmetic Test 2. Watch the 'Tricks and Tips' video again for ideas of how to support your child complete the test.Count in 2s, 5s and 10s using our favourite videos from class, find the links on eSchools.Practise counting in 2s, 5s and 10s using the worksheets on eSchools.Count pairs of socks (in 2s), how many fingers you and your family have (in 5s) and how many toes you and your family have (in 10s). Could you draw a picture to represent what you find?	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Make a reading den and enjoy sharing stories in it. Check out the ideas in the 'Reading Dens' document on eSchools.Listen to the story 'Astro Girl' by Ken Wilson-Max in the English project and then try and read it out loud with the sound muted.Read the Mae Jemison fact file to learn about another amazing astronaut.Listen to the story 'Mae Among the Stars' by Rhoda Ahmed. <ul style="list-style-type: none">Practise reading words with this week's sounds in them.Practise reading this week's tricky words.Play 'Alien Escape' on Phonics Bloom and use your phonics skills to spell the words in the pictures.Use the resource in eSchools to work on spelling words with -ing endings.After spelling the -ing words try and complete the crossword. The clues will help you decide which -ing word to write!	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Write sentences using words with this week's sounds in them.Practise writing this week's tricky words, could you put them in sentences?Write your own astronaut application form! What skills do you think you need for the job?Now that you're an astronaut, can you design your very own planet? What colour will it be? Will there be anything growing on your planet? Does anyone live on your planet?Can you remember any facts about Mae Jemison? Record your findings by designing an information poster. Use the resources on eSchools to help you.
Other things to try out this week: Theme: Space Explorers!	
<ul style="list-style-type: none">Who is Tim Peake? Why is he famous? Use the resources on eSchools to research all about him. Choose how to present what you have found out. For example, you might like to make: a mind map, a poster, a presentation or a postcard from the International Space Station.Compare Tim Peake and Neil Armstrong. What is the same and what is different?Make a space collage. In the resources area there is a nice video about how to make a collage (although it is about a landscape and not space!). Have a look around your house and find any magazines, scraps of paper or material, dry pasta, leaves from the garden, and use them to create a space themed picture. Remember to ask a grown up before you start cutting anything up! We have included templates for a rocket or Beegu picture and some pictures of other space collage ideas, but use your imagination and see what you can create.
