Home learning weekly overview – week beginning: 13.7.2020

Year 1

Maths tasks (aim to do one a day)

- Play the games set as homework on <u>Education City</u>.
- Read the 'Position and Direction Warm Up' PowerPoint to begin to learn about left/right, clockwise/anti-wise and following directions. Play the 'Movement Game' to practise your new skills!
- Cut and stick the animals into their new positions by reading how they have moved. The resources are in the maths project.
- Draw pictures to the left or right using the sheet on eSchools.
- Can you write directions for how to get to the different shops?

Phonics / Spelling tasks (aim to do one a day)

- Practise reading words with this week's sounds in them.
- Log on to <u>Education City</u> and play the games set as homework.
- Practise reading this week's tricky words. You might like to play Roll and Read or use the blank game template on eSchools to make a simple board game to help you practise reading them.
- Practise writing this week's tricky words, can you put them in a sentence?
- This week we're practising spelling words ending in -ve. Have a look at the activities on eSchools and choose one (or more!) to have a go at.

Reading tasks (aim to do one a day)

- Listen to or read 'I want my hat back' by Jon Klassen.
- Watch The Little Angel Theatre's puppet shows of Jon Klassen's stories. There are links to these on eSchools.
- Make your own puppets for the animals in 'I want my hat back' and retell the story. You might even want to film your version and upload it to eSchools.
- Listen to or read the sequel, 'This is not my hat'. Which do you prefer and why?
- Read the 'Bear Fact Cards' on eSchools and learn all about different types of bears.

Writing tasks (aim to do one a day)

- Complete 'All about me!' template for your new teacher to tell them about yourself, look out for a message from your new teacher on eSchools on Tuesday!
- Design a hat, labelling your design carefully to show what materials you will use. Have a go at making your hat!
- Write instructions for making your hat so that someone else could have a go. You might also want to evaluate your hat, writing something you like about your hat and something you would change if you made a hat again.
- Write a new page for the story of 'I want my hat back'. Who else might Bear ask if they have seen rabbit? You might want to use the template on eSchools.
- Oh no! Jon Klassen has made some mistakes in his sentences.
 Have a go at editing his work. Look out for capital letters,
 punctuation marks and the spelling of tricky words.
