 Maths tasks (aim to do one a day) Watch the 'Fact Families' clip to help you understand how 3 numbers can be linked together in a family. Play the game 'Number Fact Families', using numbers up to 10 and then 20. Have a go at making your own fact family using objects from your house. Look at the document on making a fact family in eSchools to give you some ideas. Using the 'Fact Family Houses' sheet in eSchools, have a go at writing addition and subtraction sentences using 3 numbers. Play the games set as homework in Education City. Listen to the song linked in eSchools to help you understand fact families. Phonics / Spelling tasks (aim to do one a day) Practise reading words with this week's sounds in them. Log on to Education City and play the games set as homework. Practise reading this week's tricky words. You might like to write each word in as many different colours as you can. Practise writing this week's tricky words, can you put them in a sentence? This week we're practising spelling words beginning with un- (meaning not). Have a look at the activities on eSchools and choose one (or more!) to have a go at. 		 Reading tasks (aim to do one a day) Listen to 'Wanted: The Perfect Pet' by Fiona Roberton. Can you create your own animal disguise like Spot does in the story? Send a picture to your teacher on eSchools. Read 'Perfect Pets' on Oxford Owl to find which pet would be perfect for you. There are little activities to complete while reading the book. Read 'Taking Care of Guinea Pigs' on eSchools to, or with, a grown up and have a go at answering the questions. Pets love listening to stories! Read a story to your pet or your favourite toy animal. Writing tasks (aim to do one a day) Make your own Wanted poster to advertise for your perfect pet. What would it look like, would it be able to do any special tricks? Oh no! Spot the Duck has eaten up the finger spaces in some of the sentences from 'Wanted'. Can you have a go at writing the sentence out underneath using finger spaces between words? Look carefully at the illustrations. Can you write in the thought bubble to show what Henry is thinking? Practise writing your "giraffe" letters, letters that reach up high.
