Maths tasks (aim to do one a day)			Reading tasks (aim to do one a day)		
 Watch the videos on the White Rose Maths website (Summer Term Week 8). https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-2/ Lesson 1: Count sides and vertices on 2D shapes. Lesson 2: Count faces, edges and vertices on 3D shapes. Lesson 3: Sorting 2D and 3D shapes. Lesson 4: Patterns with 2D and 3D shapes. (See eSchools for accompanying activity sheets). Have a go at answering the arithmetic questions on eSchools. Remember to draw things to help you! Play maths games in the homework area of Education City. Practise times tables on TT Rockstars. Aim for 5-10 minutes a day, if you can. 		 Read a book or listen to a story (every day if you can). Think about a story you know well or are reading. If you could design a new character for the story, what would they be like? You might like to draw your new character. Have a go at the reading comprehension on eSchools about seahorses. Read the riddles. Can you work out which sea creature they describe? Look for our 'Words of the Week' or words from the spelling tasks in books or texts that you are reading. Make a list of all the words you find. 			
Spelling / Grammar tasks (aim to do one a day)			Writing tasks (aim to do one a day)		
 Practise spelling our 'Words of the Week'. Practise spelling words which require a double consonant before adding 'ing' or 'ed' e.g. pat – patting – patted, hop – hopping – hopped. (See eSchools). Revise the uses of capital letters. Check the sentences on eSchools for the correct use of capital letters and explain when/why they are needed. Play spelling/grammar games in the homework area of Education City. Using only the letters from the word 'starfish', how many other words can you spell? 			 Write sentences using the 'Words of the Week' or words from the spelling tasks. Look at the picture on eSchools of the person on the boat. Use your imagination to write a description of who the person could be, why they are on a boat and what they could be doing. Create an acrostic poem about the seaside. It could be about the beach or sea creatures. You could use the template on eSchools or make your own using a word related to the seaside. Write sentences to describe the sea creatures. Think about ways you could make your sentences exciting. Practise joining your handwriting using the sentences on eSchools.
