

Jay, Alex and Sophia are coming to Arbury Primary School

What will I do in school?


You will have so much fun at school, learning new things and making new friends.

The children are practising writing their names. Katie asks Jay for the pencils.


"Please can I have the red pencil, Jay?"

When you need to go to the toilet, just let your teacher know. When you leave your classroom, you will put your name on the checking out board to show that you have gone to the toilet.


Alex has asked to go to the toilet.


Alex puts their name on the board and goes to the toilet.

What if I am hungry or thirsty?

You can have a fruit snack if you are hungry. If you are thirsty, you can use your water bottle or the water fountain near the classroom.

At lunchtime, you will go to the toilet and wash your hands.

Your grown-ups will be able to see what food there will be for lunch on the menus which are on display outside the classrooms and in the playground.


You choose what you would like to eat and then sit at your table.

After lunch, you will play. Sophia is worried that she has no one to play with so waits at the 'Friendship Stop'.


"I will play with you," says Alex.

What happens at the end of the school day?






