Message from Mrs Rawlins – 21.10.21

I think we should all feel quite proud of ourselves for keeping going until half-term – the children are definitely tired, and I have a feeling that staff, parents and carers are all experiencing that very same feeling! Tomorrow (22nd October) is our last day of the half-term, school is closed for the holiday all week, and also on Monday 1st November (when teachers have a training day). Children are back in school on **Tuesday 2nd November**.

Quite a few bits of information from me this week:

Foodbank donations: A huge thank you for all of the generous donations you have sent in. We will get them off to the local Foodbank, and we know each item will be very much appreciated.

Wear Red Day (Show Racism the Red Card): Tomorrow, we hope that lots of children may wish to wear something red to school, as we support the 'Show Racism the Red Card' campaign. In my video assembly tomorrow, we will be thinking about this statement and what it means for us: 'At Arbury we say NO to racism, but YES to kindness.'

eSafety reminder: We know that children are often using websites and apps independently, as well as internet searching. In school, we are protected by a heavy firewall, but at home, it can be tricky to protect children from inappropriate content.
