<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Watch the videos on the White Rose Maths website (Summer Term Week 3). <p>Lesson 1: Fact families - addition and subtraction bonds to 20.</p> <p>Lesson 2: Compare number sentences.</p> <p>Lesson 3: Related facts.</p> <p>Lesson 4: Add and subtract ones.</p> <p>There is an activity sheet for each video, which you might like to have a go at. (See eSchools for further guidance).</p> <p>https://whiterosemaths.com/homelearning/year-2/</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> Experiment with making different shapes using things that you can find in your home e.g. playdough, paper, construction toys etc. Play maths games in the homework area of Education City. Practise times tables on TT Rockstars. Aim for 5-10 minutes a day, if you can. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read a book or listen to a story (every day if you can). Read/listen to the story 'Lila and the Secret of Rain'. Discuss the story with a grown-up at home. You might like to use the question prompts. You can write your answers if you would like. Complete the reading comprehension about the book 'Lila and the Secret of Rain'. (See eSchools for the story). Look for our 'Word of the Week' or words from the spelling tasks in books or texts that you are reading (e.g. stories, on items around your home).
Spelling / Grammar tasks (aim to do one a day)	Writing tasks (aim to do one a day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Practise spelling our 'Word of the Week'. Practise using apostrophes to make and spell contractions e.g. would not - wouldn't, have not - haven't, did not - didn't. Remember that the apostrophe replaces the missing letter(s). (See eSchools). Practise using apostrophes to show possession e.g. The lion's mane is soft and hairy. (See eSchools). Play spelling/grammar games in the homework area of Education City. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Write sentences using the 'Word of the Week' or words from the spelling tasks. Look at the pictures. What do you think Lila might be thinking? Write your ideas in the thought bubbles. (See eSchools). Write a story which is set in Kenya. It can be about anything you like e.g. a safari adventure, a day at Mount Kenya, an explorer discovering different places in Kenya... Write a diary extract, imagining that you are Lila from the story. (See eSchools). Use the checklist to check and edit your writing.
Other things to try out this week: Theme: Weather and Climate	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Make a daily weather chart showing the weather where you live. You could use the template on eSchools or create one of your own. Research the weather in Kenya each day and compare it to the weather where you live. Find out about hot and cold areas of the world. Colour/collage hot areas of the map in red and cold areas in blue (See eSchools). You might like to find out more about a country with a very hot or very cold climate. What might people wear if they were visiting these countries? Which animals can be found there?
