

<b>Maths tasks (aim to do one a day)</b>	<b>Reading tasks (aim to do one a day)</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Play maths games in the homework area of Education City.</li><li>• Practise times tables on TT Rockstars. Aim for 5-10 minutes a day, if you can.</li><li>• Practise using coins to make an amount. How many different ways can you find to make the same amount? (See eSchools).</li><li>• Practise adding money and giving change. (See eSchools for some resources).</li><li>• Go on a shape hunt around your home. How many different 3D shapes can you find? Can you find a cube, a cuboid, a sphere, a cylinder, a cone and a triangular prism?</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Read a book or listen to a story (every day if you can).</li><li>• Look for our 'Word of the Week' or words from the spelling tasks in books or texts that you are reading (e.g. stories, on items around your home).</li><li>• Complete the reading comprehension about leopards. You can choose whether to do the one star, two star or three star questions. (See eSchools).</li><li>• Read the clues and guess which African animal they describe. (See eSchools).</li></ul>
<b>Phonics / Spelling tasks (aim to do one a day)</b>	<b>Writing tasks (aim to do one a day)</b>
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Practise spelling our 'Word of the Week'. Can you find and colour the tricky part?</li><li>• Play spelling games in the homework area of Education City.</li><li>• Practise adding the suffixes 'er' and 'est' to adjectives e.g. strong – stronger – strongest or happy – happier - happiest.</li><li>• Using only the letters from the word 'elephant', how many other words can you spell?</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Write sentences using the 'Word of the Week' or words from the spelling tasks.</li><li>• Practise letter formation or some joined handwriting. You might like to practise by using the sentences you will find on eSchools.</li><li>• Look at the sentences on eSchools. The punctuation has disappeared! Can you put it in?</li><li>• Write sentences using verbs and adjectives to describe what the animals are doing (see eSchools for pictures of animals).</li><li>• Make an information poster about an African animal of your choice. You could use the template on eSchools or design your own. You could include where they live, what they eat and what they look like. Remember to write in full sentences and include pictures!</li></ul>
<b>Other things to try out this week:</b> <b>Theme: Safari</b>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Look at the safari map. Use the compass directions (north, east, south and west) to navigate your way around. You could follow the directions on eSchools or even write some of your own.</li><li>• Describe the food chains of some African animals. You will find some to order and describe on eSchools or you can research and draw your own.</li></ul>
