Providing release for strategic leadership of sport.	<p>School sport senior manager, PE Curriculum Leaders (KS1 and KS2) have continued to work together to improve the overall quality of PE and school sports in our school.</p> <p>Leaders have attended the CSSP Virtual Network Meetings to maintain an up-to-date knowledge and understanding of high quality PE, thus ensuring the delivery of high quality PE in our school.</p> <p>59% of our pupils, in years 1, 3, 5 and 6, had the opportunity to take part in inter-school competition. There wasn't a competition for EYFS this year and the competitions for Years 2 and 4 were indoor competitions at a time when Covid rates were beginning to rise again.</p> <p>We took part in one inter-school competition this year – the Quadkids Athletics competition for Y5/6.</p>		
Paying support staff to run/support the running of clubs and competitions	<p>Clubs were reinstated this year. Providing free places for pupils in after school sports clubs	<p>We reintroduced clubs this year having had a break during the pandemic. In KS1, we had several lunchtime clubs including football clubs for Year 1 and Year 2 plus golf clubs for both of these year groups. There was also an after school Sport and Spell club targeting Y1 children who needed additional support with their phonics.</p> <p>Cost: Included in Teacher/TA and sports coach costs</p>		
2021-2022 swimming outcomes for children at the end of KS2.	<p>This Y6 cohort had school swimming lessons in Y4 which was disrupted due to the Covid lockdown. 44% are able to swim a distance of 25m.</p>
