Communication and Language

We will:

- learn a variety of poems and rhymes
- learn and use new vocabulary relating to our 'Animals' topic
- ask and answer questions
- listen to and talk about selected non-fiction to develop and deep familiarity with new knowledge and vocabulary
- join sentences using 'because', 'or', 'and'
- use a range of tenses in spoken language
- · explain how things work and why they may happen.

Literacy

We will:

- learn and retell the story of 'Dear Zoo' and 'The Three Little Pigs'
- use our phonic knowledge to write words, labels and captions
- read and share books together making predictions, talking about characters and imagining different endings
- continue to learn our letter sounds recognising, saying and writing them
- blend and segment letters in order to read and spell short words
- · read some common exception words by sight
- point to letters and track left to right when reading
- read and re-read books using our phonic skills.

Expressive Arts and Design

We will:

- learn a range of songs, rhymes, poems and stories to perform/ tell orally
- sing entire songs and perform solo or in a group
- move in time to the pulse of music
- practise keeping a steady beat while playing instruments
- create visual representations of sounds
- explore colours and colour mixing
- plan, design and make a rain shaker.

Physical Development

.We will:

- develop and improve our pencil grips, aiming for a tripod grip
- use appropriate pressure when drawing and mark making and begin to draw with increased accuracy
- develop fine and gross motor skills using a range of manipulatives, particularly during daily 'Funky Fingers' sessions
- talk about how to brush teeth and why it is important with our 'My Smile' programme
- Develop balance and strength by riding balance bikes, climbing, running, jumping, hopping and skipping, particularly during PE (Monday) and Forest School (Wednesday).

Maths

We will:

- represent number 0-10 with numerals and objects
- compare numbers, using the vocabulary 'more/less than', 'fewer', 'the same as' and 'equal to'
- say one more and one less than a number
- explore the composition of numbers to 10
- automatically recall number bonds up to 5
- describe and compare weight
- describe and compare capacity
- describe and compare length
- begin to add numbers together.

Personal, Social and Emotional Development My Emotions

We will:

- name and describe different emotions and feelings, like 'happy', 'angry', 'miserable'
- describe physical changes to the body which occur when feeling unwell, anxious, tired or sad
- explore different strategies for staying calm in the face of frustration
- recognise and consider the feelings of others.

Our RE unit is: Celebrations.

Understanding the World

We will:

- name and describe different animals
- learn about a variety of environments and which animals live there, including: the polar regions, savannahs, ocean, rainforests and woodland areas
- talk about how we care for the natural world around us
- observe and interact with natural processes, e.g. ice melting
- talk about how we can protect our planet and why this is important
- learn about Spring Festival and how it is celebrated around the world.
