Message from Mrs Rawlins

Thank you for all you are doing to support learning at home. There have been huge amounts of lovely ideas and activities appearing all over the internet since it was announced that schools would be closed - but it can all seem very overwhelming! We know that it will take time for everyone to settle into daily routines; we also know that you are keen to support your children in the weeks ahead, and that we want to work alongside you to do that.

Remember that this period of closure is likely to be a marathon and not a sprint; don't try to do everything at once and do be flexible - some days will be easier than others! Initially, this time is about consolidating learning and practising rather than introducing new concepts. Reading is still important on a daily basis, 10 minutes on TT Rockstars for children in Years 2-6 is great, and engaging with learning activities through eSchools will give access to a range of things to do at home. Children brought home a pack with some work to look at during the first couple of weeks of closure.

Home Learning Hub

We are developing a Home Learning Hub on our website, which will give quick and easy access to information and ideas for learning at home. As we move forward, a weekly overview will inform you about suggested learning for each year group, and resources for the children to use will be on eSchools as 'homework'. Please bear with us as we begin to add materials to this Hub.

Using eSchools:

eSchools is our digital learning platform. Children can email their class teacher by sending a message from their eSchools page. It is a secure system, which does not allow messaging or emailing beyond just the children/staff in our school. We have set up login details and passwords for EYFS/KS1 and will get these sent out to you shortly.

Teachers are updating their class eSchools pages, putting on activities and starting discussions with the children - they are very keen for children to message them, as they are all very much missing teaching their class. Teachers will be available each weekday to respond to children's messages and questions. Mrs Whiting and Mrs Rawlins are also very keen to hear from children via eSchools! Children can upload any work they have done, and their teacher can respond.
