Preparing for school

Read stories about starting school. Here are a few examples:

- Starting school Janet & Alan Ahlberg.
- Boris starts school Carrie Weston & Tim Warnes.
- Alfie and the big boys Shirley Hughes.
- Jellybean goes to school Margaret Roc & Laura Hughes.
- Harry and the dinosaurs go to school Ian Whybrow.
- Charlie and Lola: I am too absolutely small for school Lauren Child.
- Topsy and Tim: Start school Jean & Gareth Adamson.
- Come to School too, blue kangaroo Emma Chichester Clarke.
- Read our own book called 'Jay, Alex and Sophia are coming to Arbury Primary School'.

Early Literacy skills to practice:

- Sit and listen to a story with increasing focus.
- Talk about the story sharing favourite parts etc.
- Be able to recognise your name when it is written down.
- Practise holding a pencil with increasing control (working towards a tripod grip if possible).
- Work on writing your name.
- Be able to identify sounds in the environment.





Early Mathematic skills to practice:

- Counting in order to 10.
- Recognising numbers to 10.
- Counting objects to 10 (1:1 correspondence touching each object, counting slowly and accurately).
- Identify colours.
- Go on shape hunts and look for shapes in the environment.
- Focus on naming the common 2D shapes square, rectangle, circle, triangle.





Health and self-care skills:

- Be able to use the toilet and wash your hands independently.
- Be able to get yourself dressed maybe try getting changed into your PE kit by yourself and then put your uniform back on.
 - Be able to put your shoes and socks on.
 - Be able to use a knife and fork independently with increasing accuracy.
 - Practise putting your coat on and zipping it up by yourself.
