<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Set up a pretend shop in your house, add price tags to things and enjoy playing. You could use real money, the printable money on eSchools or even draw your own money, looking carefully at the different coins. Using the resource on eSchools, work out how much the ice creams cost. Look in your purse or piggy bank at the different coins. What different colours and shapes of coins can you see? Which one is worth the most? How much is there altogether? Play a matching game with coins and their values, you could use the resources on eSchools or make your own. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read a story out loud and send your teacher a video through eSchools! Read the 'Real and Nonsense words' from the PowerPoint in eSchools. Remember to use your combinations to help you! Listen to the story 'Beegu' by Alexis Deacon in the English project. Can you 'speak like an expert' and use the keywords to tell someone all about the story 'Beegu'? Why don't you mute the sound on the 'Beegu' video and read the story out loud yourself?

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Practise reading words with this week's sounds in them. Practise reading this week's tricky words. Play this alien game on Phonics Play using phase 5 sounds to help you. Can you give the aliens funny names using different combinations? Use the resource in eSchools to practise spelling words with the endings –er (meaning more) and –est (meaning most). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Write sentences using words with this week's sounds in them. Practise writing this week's tricky words, could you put them in sentences? What would Beegu say at different points in the story? Use the hints and tips in eSchools to help you. Can you re-write the story of Beegu, using the zigzag book template in eSchools? If you went in to space what would you take with you in your rocket?
<p>Other things to try out this week: Theme: Explorers... in space!</p>	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Who was Neil Armstrong? Why is he famous? Use the resources on eSchools to research all about him. Choose how to present what you have found out – you could make a mind map, a poster, presentation, or even write a postcard from the moon. Can you make a rocket? You might want to make it out of lego, card, or recycled materials – or maybe you have an even better idea! Have a look in the resources area if you need some inspiration. Can you fit a toy astronaut in your rocket? Plan your rocket first – draw and label the materials you will need. Pretend you are on your way to space inside your rocket. Look out of the window. What can you see? Draw or paint a picture. Remember to send us a photo or video of your rocket!
