<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Click on the links in eSchools to play ‘<a href="#">Hit the Button</a>’ and number bond games on <a href="#">Education City</a>.</li><li>Complete Summer Test 4 and listen to the hints and tips in the maths project to help you.</li><li>Using the ‘Number bond rainbows’ to help you, have a go at the ‘Rainbow to 10 activity’.</li><li>Challenge yourself to complete the ‘Number bonds to 20 robots’.</li><li>Read the ‘Number bonds stories’ and write the number bonds for each story.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Listen to or read ‘Save the Whale’ by Gill Munton.</li><li>Listen to ‘Dear Greenpeace’ by Simon James.</li><li>Read about different whales on the <a href="#">World Wildlife Fund</a> website, as suggested at the end of ‘Save the Whale’.</li><li>Read the ‘Sea Creature Fact Cards’ on eSchools to, or with, a grown up and have a go at answering the questions.</li><li>Read and sort the facts about whales and fish into the Venn diagram, using the resource on eSchools.</li></ul>

<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Practise reading words with this week’s sounds in them.</li><li>Log on to <a href="#">Education City</a> and play the games set as homework.</li><li>Practise reading this week’s tricky words. You might like to see how many times you can write each tricky word in one minute. Set a timer to have a race!</li><li>Practise writing this week’s tricky words, can you put them in a sentence?</li><li>This week we’re practising spelling compound words (pop + corn = popcorn). Have a look at the activities on eSchools and choose one (or more!) to have a go at.</li></ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>Write a description of a whale. Think about its appearance and the facts you have learned from ‘Save the Whale’.</li><li>Write a list of all the words in ‘Save the Whale’ which have the modifying e combination in them.</li><li>Write your own ‘Dear Greenpeace’ letter explaining why we need to look after whales. You might like to use the special whale paper on eSchools.</li><li>Listen to Miss Sheldon reading “dictation sentences” from ‘Save the Whale’ and have a go at writing them down.</li><li>Practise writing your “tortoise” letters, letters that crouch carefully on the line.</li></ul>
