

Maths tasks (aim to do one a day)	Reading tasks (aim to do one a day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Practise multiplication and division facts for the 4 x table. Create 5 addition and subtraction word problems for a family member to solve. You have £100. Find out the cost of 5 real-life items you would like to buy and work out how much money you would have left if you bought them all. Find a basic recipe (e.g. for pancakes). Work out how much of each ingredient you would need if you were doubling the recipe. You could try halving it too. This week begins on 27.04.20. When is the next date where all six of these digits will be used again? 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Read out loud to someone you live with or someone on the phone. It could even be to a toy or a pet! Draw a setting from a book that you are reading this week. Use the description in the book and you can label it if you like. Which character from a book would you most like to meet in real life? Why? See if you can find any instructions in your home. Have a go at reading them. Which were your favourite instructions? Write a sentence explaining why.
Spelling tasks (aim to do one a day)	Writing tasks (aim to do one a day)
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Practise 5 new spellings from the Year 3/4 spelling list using the 'look, say, cover, write, check' technique. Create 5 questions using a practised spelling in each. Pick one of the spellings and make other words using only the letters in the spelling. Can you create other words using your spellings by using prefixes and/or suffixes? Find synonyms for one of your spellings. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Use verbs and adverbs to describe what each of the animals in the picture is doing. What could each animal be saying? Write some speech. Sentence doctor – can you fix these sentences? Read the instructions. Fill in (or copy) the table to show which words are time connectives, imperative 'bossy' verbs and adverbs. Long write: write a set of instructions for <u>How to Survive Lockdown!</u> Have a look at the example. Once you have finished your instructions, you can use the checklist to edit.
Other things to try out this week: Theme: The Human Body	
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Pick a major organ found in the human body (e.g. the brain) and find out more about it. You could find out about the following: what it does, how it works, why it's important and what it looks like. Or you could find out your own facts. You could then use this research to create an information text about the organ.
