Could you try these activities at home, over the Easter break? How many can you do?



<p>Design a fitness circuit or short exercise class, with 7 different moves/ tasks.</p> <p>Get some tips from Joe Wicks! Can you include different exercises to work your whole body?</p>	<p>Music – can you write your own song or rap? Maybe you could write about being at school or home and how that makes you feel but it can be about whatever you choose!</p>	<p>Hand written letter – can you use your excellent letter writing skills to write to a family member or a friend who you cannot see at the moment? Could you include a drawing? This might really cheer them up 😊.</p>	<p>Time to talk – can you arrange a call with a friend? Can you play a board game with your family?</p>	<p>Book review – can you read a book and write a detailed review of it? Can you share this with your friends? Include a drawing of the front cover.</p>
<p>Organise a restaurant in your home. Could you help an adult cook dinner? Could you help prepare breakfast and lunch? Take photos and write a menu!</p>	<p>Portraits and Photography – take photos of your family members or an object, considering light and different textures. Can you use these photographs to draw portraits in pen or pencil, thinking about light and tone?</p>	<p>Practise your times tables! Use Times Table Rockstars or write out as many as you can, on paper!</p>	<p>Diary – can you create a video or a written diary which documents your time in isolation? This might be something that is talked about years in the future!</p>	<p>Finger paint animals – see how many different animals you can create using just a finger print and a pen (once the paint is dry!)</p>
<p>Mapping Skills – Identify the countries or cities your family members originate from or where they live. Can you plot them on a map? Can you create a fact file on these places?</p>	<p>Quiz – can you design a quiz for your friends or family? You will need to think of a set of questions and answers which can be grouped into different categories.</p>	<p>Organise a treasure hunt – can you write questions and clues to guide your family to the hidden treasure in your house?</p>	<p>Music from the past – research music from a different decade! What were the most popular bands around? Can you learn a song and perform it or film it?</p>	<p>Interview – can you write a list of questions to ask a family member and then record their answers? Try to ask questions you don't already know the answer to! For example 'If you could be any animal, what would you be?'</p>
